A holder of the Construction Carpenter level II professional certificate:

- is familiar with the good building practice and ensures quality
- complies with occupational safety requirements for construction works
- organises his/her work in compliance with regulations and in a safe manner
- is able to calculate the consumption of materials and the hours of work
- is able to read architectural drawings
- stakes out the main building dimensions
- transfers height marks
- uses measuring instruments
- is familiar with general principles of construction and applies them
- is familiar with building materials and their properties
- is familiar with the main construction tools and machines
- is able to strop
- is familiar with the types, properties and possible damage of construction timber
- is familiar with wood processing machines and tools
- prepares, erects and dismantles standard and customised formworks
- builds wooden stages and scaffolding
- builds wooden frameworks
- builds external and internal walls (e.g., gypsum plasterboards, etc.) and intermediate floors
- builds roof and eave structures and lays roof coverings
- installs windows, door assemblies, gates and fittings
- installs internal and external lining of buildings
- installs beads, cornices and wooden floor coverings
- installs thermal insulation and insulation materials
- is persistent, emotionally stable, accurate and diligent
