3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

A holder of the make-up artist level II professional certificate:

- is able to work in a sustainable manner with regard to the customer's health and the environment
- is able to serve the customer in his or her mother tongue and two foreign languages
- is able to interact agreeably with customers, colleagues and employers
- is knowledgeable in facial anatomy and physiology, skin diseases and skin hygiene, essential chemistry, colour and light theory, make-up history, make-up fashion trends, and knows how to put this knowledge to use
- is able to perform a facial analysis and use this knowledge to accomplish a distinctive make-up
- is able to analyse colour types and use this knowledge to accomplish distinctive make-up jobs
- is familiar with and has a good command of the application techniques of make-up and grease-paint products
- is able to perform permanent dyeing of eyebrows and eyelashes
- is able to fashion hairdos
- is able to complete make-up jobs according to customers' idiosyncrasies and purpose of their make-up
- is able to sell and present make-up products
- is able to take into account work and fire safety requirements and provide basic first-aid
- understands legislation and labour law related to the profession
- is able to perform make-up and grease-paint jobs according to pre-determined designs and calculate the necessary amounts of make-up products per jobs
- is familiar with grease-paint techniques executed on the basis of the principle of light and shadow
- is able to make and use wigs, accessories, beards and other facial hair
- is able to determine the era of various realistic costumes
- is able to fashion historical hairdos to both customers and wigs
- is familiar with historical styles and able to apply them in grease-paint jobs

The objectives of the Professions Chamber include establishment and development of an integrated and organised professional qualifications system, establishment of prerequisites for achieving comparability of the qualifications of Estonian employees and acknowledgement of other countries, as well as management of the state register of professions as the authorised processor.</p>
<p>Level of the certificate (national or international)</p> <p>National Estonian professional qualifications system Level II</p>	<p>Grading scale / Pass requirements</p> <p>The certification of the awarded profession of make-up artist level II takes place as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1) an examination of knowledge (a written examination with an oral defence procedure) 2) practical work examination (2 jobs) <p>A person is allowed to take the practical examination if he or she has passed the written examination of knowledge with a positive result.</p> <p>The written examination consists of 20 questions and the examination is considered as passed if the examination result is at least 70 % of the maximum result.</p> <p>At the practical skills examination the applicant of level II must perform 2 jobs :</p> <p><u>an historical realistic grease-paint portrait of a woman</u> (film) – time of work 90 min and <u>a realistic character grease-paint of a man (big stage)</u> – time of work 120 min.</p>
