- operate within the limits of authorisation received, comply with confidentiality requirements and ensure data protection;
- take responsibility for the customers and for the safety and security of their property;
- ensure inviolability of a crime site and preservation of evidence;
- act in dangerous and special situations;
- comply with the principles and requirements for handling weapons and special equipment;
- follow instructions and cooperate;
- comply with the safety requirements for the work environment;
- fill out work-related documents;
- evaluate life threatening situations at the site, evaluate the condition of casualties and provide first aid, transport casualties;
- maintain good physical form;
- comply with the requirements of professional code of conduct.
