- is able to interpret test results and make decisions within the appropriate area of competence;
- is familiar with the equipment and tools used in radiological diagnostic and treatment;
- knows the foundations of emergency medicine and is able to provide first aid;
- is able to manage and organise his/her own work;
- is able to work with documents;
- is able to service, advise and instruct patients and their relatives;
- is able to continue his/her professional development and supervise and instruct colleagues;
- is able to cooperate with radiographers and other professionals in the fields of medicine and social work;
- follows the occupational environment safety rules applicable in radiology;
- follows the professional code of ethics.
