- is able to perform mechanical face cleansing
- is able to perform face, neck and lower neck massage
- is able to chemically dye lashes and eyebrows
- models eyebrows
- performs ear piercing using the gun method
- is able to perform depilation
- is able to provide preparatory and follow-up care in case of aesthetic surgery
- is able to provide hand and nail care and hand massage
- is able to provide foot care and foot massage
- is able to provide body care and body massage
- is able to do make-up
- is familiar with the technical instruments required for cosmetic procedures and is able to use them
- is familiar with the cosmetic and care products and is able to use them
- is familiar with human anatomy and physiology
- sells cosmetic products
- manages his/her work in a salon efficiently, economically and in compliance with safety requirements
