3. PROFILE OF SKILLS AND COMPETENCIES

A holder of assistant locomotive driver I professional certificate knows and can use:

- professional terminology in Estonian and/or Russian
- communication and safety equipment installed on rolling stock
- railway signals and signs
- organisation of railway traffic, documents used in traffic organisation and regulations of oral communication with traffic controllers

A holder of assistant locomotive driver I professional certificate can:

- find defects of rolling stock and where possible, remove them while on the road
- act in the emergency situations of fire and railway traffic accident
- give first aid
- perform a braking test and issue a braking notice
- encircle a dangerous area and standing rolling stock at the station and along the open track
- fix carriages by means of wheel chocks according to the station technological management act or the requirements of a branch line guide

Has skills in one of the following special fields:

- the working principle of a diesel-electric locomotive, its supplies, requirements of roadworthiness and organisation of maintenance and repair
- the working principle of an electric train, its supplies, requirements of roadworthiness and organisation of maintenance and repair
- the working principle of a diesel locomotive, its supplies, requirements of roadworthiness and organisation of maintenance and repair.

4. RANGE OF OCCUPATIONS ACCESSIBLE TO THE HOLDER OF THE CERTIFICATE ⁽¹⁾

An assistant locomotive driver belongs to a locomotive crew. An assistant locomotive driver specialises as: an assistant diesel-electric locomotive driver, assistant electric train driver or assistant diesel train driver. May also work as a yardmaster or freight train attendant
