Holder of the Logger level I professional certificate:

- is familiar with the construction of a power saw and other necessary tools and safety equipment, and is able to use and maintain them;
- knows the right fuel mixtures and lubricants and is able to use them;
- knows the species of forest trees and their properties;
- is familiar with timber harvesting technologies, as well as with quality, measuring and marking procedures used for round timber;
- is familiar with the legislation pertaining to the profession;
- complies with occupational safety requirements (occupational health and safety, fire safety, electrical safety, waste handling) and is able to administer first aid;
- follows the technical guidelines for developing a logging area, creating optimal working conditions for the transporters of timber;
- complies with the principles of sustainable forest management;
- is able to use correct and ergonomic working techniques for logging, reforestation, maintenance of young growths and forest cultures, and maintenance of drainage systems;
- complies with the professional code of ethics.
